School Context

Birchwood Elementary is a vibrant educational institution committed to ensuring a positive and nurturing Français Plus environment for engaged learning and personal growth for students from diverse backgrounds. Our school community comprises a dynamic mix of 375 students, each bringing unique talents, perspectives, and aspirations to our classrooms.

The school building is situated in a forested residential area in the off-island community of St. Lazare, Qc. Birchwood is an ecologically friendly construction and has a geothermal heating/cooling system. There is a fullsized gymnasium, a Drama room, Fine Arts room, library, resource room, daycare facilities, lunchtime cafeteria service and classrooms fitted with the most recent technological equipment. The technological amenities in the building are designed to support future educational directions. Our school also prioritizes ecologically responsible practices: recycling, composting, vegetable gardens, honey bees and an environment-friendly cafeteria.

Our school is composed of families from a number of off-island communities with various socio-economic backgrounds. The socio-economic levels in our communities contribute to the unique fabric of Birchwood Elementary. Our school and community strengths lie in fostering a sense of inclusivity, where each student is valued and supported. The collaborative efforts of teachers, parents, and community members create an environment that encourages academic achievement, personal growth, and social responsibility.

As a school community we are very proud of the following strengths we bring to the educational experiences of our students: caring and committed staff, flexible pedagogy (Deep Learning) and strong community partnerships. These are reflected in the many learning experiences, both in and out of the classroom (field trips, extra-curricular activities and overnight trips), offered to our students.

Our school also faces challenges which we diligently work towards addressing in order to support our students and community. We are committed to better supporting the increasing social-emotional needs of our students. This will be accomplished through providing our team more opportunities to work together and communicate effectively, maximizing our alignment and strengthening coherence in addressing needs and behaviour.

At Birchwood Elementary, we take pride in our collaborative community where students, families, teachers, support staff, and professionals work together to create an atmosphere of academic rigor, creativity, and personal growth. Through a rich tapestry of experiences, Birchwood Elementary aims to inspire inquisitive learners, empowered leaders, and caring global citizens.

Programs of Study and Approaches to Learning

For our school, the Français Plus program means that the French Immersion program is extended into the Cycle 2 years. Students receive approximately 85% of their school day delivered in French. The intention is to solidify the students' abilities in French as a second language before they move on to a predominantly English education. As they move up through to graduating high school, into CEGEP and University, or by following one of our alternative programs in high school, a solid base of French language is tremendously advantageous for our students in Quebec.

Our dedicated team of educators plays a pivotal role in shaping the educational experience at Birchwood Elementary. With a focus on academic excellence and social emotional health, our twenty-eight highly qualified teachers are passionate about fostering a love for learning and equipping students with the skills they need for success in an ever-evolving world. Our school is also centered on the Arts, students have the opportunity to work with local artists on yearly special projects.

Supporting the academic and extracurricular endeavors of our students is a team of twenty support staff members who directly support our students, and contribute to the smooth functioning of various administrative and logistical aspects of the school. Their commitment to creating a conducive and organized environment ensures that students can fully engage in their educational journey.

In addition to our teaching and support staff, six professionals (speech and language pathologist, psychologist, consultant in inclusive education, social work officer, spiritual animator, and consultant for Autism Spectrum Disorder), work collaboratively to address the diverse needs of our student body. This comprehensive approach to education underscores our commitment to providing a well-rounded and inclusive learning experience for all.
